



Finding a juror willing to jury an online competition is a different situation, as there is no personal presence needed and no workshop involved.

Margaret has always been a painter, starting with oils in her 20's. After having children who got into everything, she switched to acrylics which would dry before the kids could touch them. She dabbled in other media and loved them all. Beautiful color was her only criteria. Her favorite watercolor paints are Daniel Smith.

When she moved from Chicago to Chattanooga five years ago, *Art Creations* asked her to teach watercolors, which she knew used a different technique. Teaching improved her own work, keeping ahead of her students.

Margaret is an elected member of the artists' co-op, *In-Town Gallery*.

That's just a brief description of a timeconsuming and complicated task. Her expertise aided the artists to complete their entries successfully. After receiving the juror's selections, Pat sent out the acceptance letters to the 30 artists.

Pat Coffey Patrick grew up in Myrtle, North Mississippi and majored in chemical engineering at Mississippi State University. Her only art in college was drawing blueprints.

While working for the TN Dept. of Environment & Conservation's Division of Water Pollution Control for 37 years Pat observed the variety of landscapes and flowers in TN and wanted to paint them. She began taking classes, and when she retired was able to devote more time to her artistic expression.

Pat is a member of the *Two Rivers* Society of Painters and the Nashville

SOCIAL MEDIA - FACEBOOK Lets Get Connected!

This issue of ArtBeat is focusing on connecting.....to our medium and to each other.. Perhaps one of the easiest and most effective ways that our organization has for staying connected on a day-to-day basis is our current TnWS Facebook page.

Originally created for a way for members of the organization to connect, the group page has evolved to include well over 300 members, fewer than half, however, actually belonging to TnWS. So as the group has changed, the goals and activities promoted have evolved as well.

The main focus remains the organization and its goals, but expanding to others who are interested in the medium has enriched all the interactions. The only question asked upon joining the FB group is where the member lives in Tennessee.

With membership in the closed group limited to people living in TN, the hope is that proximity may at times translate virtual relationships into real ones and also that some of the virtual members will join the organization.

The scope of abilities and experiences of the group members runs the range of those who are trying water-color for the first time up to and including professional artists who hold signature membership in some of the most prestigious watercolor organizations both national and international.

In spite of the variances, a very caring and welcoming and supportive community has developed. When individuals join the group, Tuva usually introduces them and invites the membership to join in the welcome. What we like to call our "welcome wagon" comes out. Members comment, welcoming the new member with enthusiasm. This practice was never planned nor anticipated, but it has become a community tradition that undoubtedly

new members appreciate.

It is so incredibly heartening to watch when a newcomer posts for the first time and is met with words of praise and encouragement. Who among us wouldn't welcome that?

Generally the group is self-maintaining with members sharing questions, tips, and images. Questions are answered generously by those who have the answers; images are met with encouragement and supportive responses; tips are received with gratitude. Individuals share their exhibits and awards and members celebrate those accomplishments. We recognize over and over again that we all have something to learn. Nobody has all the answers. The sharings are meant to be noncompetitive.

On occasion, we issue challenges for members to respond to visually. Challenges include things like paintings done on alternative surfaces; those done predominantly in a certain color; seasonal images or images along a certain theme. All are met with encouraging support.

If by chance someone in the group persists in critical comments that became offensive or demeaning, that person is banned from the group by one of the administrators.

We report that the Facebook interaction is far better and more successful than either of us ever thought it would be. The time was right. The platform seems to meet a need we all experience to various degrees - to reach out and connect to those of like mind or interest who can challenge us to grow and reach our own goals.

TnWS member Laurin McCracken is the leader of the US Team of watercolorists. He has become a world renowned artist. Tuva Stephens has been invited to participate in this exhibition for the third time, and Mary Spellings has also had her painting included.

The most important contemporary watercolorists of the world are invited to meet together in Fabriano, Italy. Over 2,000 artists representing 80 countries convene there to view the 1,200 selected works which are exhibited at venues throughout the city, giving visitors a tour of historic and architectural sites.

Fabriano drawing and watercolor paper is produced in the local paper mill and has achieved international prestige.

ARTIST PROFILE FEATURE ... Jean Porter



Favorite quote:

"Fashion is only the attempt to realize art in living forms"

Sir Francis Bacon

Raised in Virginia, Jean Porter has covered the country from east to west and back again.

Her interest in fashion design began when she was old enough to use a sewing machine and start her journey into the creative world. In high school she spent her Saturdays sewing all day. "I made everything, even lined suits, plus bound buttonholes, and evening dresses." At graduation she received the "Homemaking Award".

While in Virginia she attended college, majoring in English, with a minor in French and History, graduating with a BA in Education. She worked on her certification in Library Science and was an elementary school librarian for several years. Jean also taught grades 4, 5, 6 and 7. After moving to Atlanta she continued to teach 7th grade.

It was in Atlanta that Jean enrolled in the Barbizon Modeling School, graduated, and did a short stint in the fashion world.

Heading west, Jean moved to Utah where she earned her Masters in Education specializing in Learning Disabilities. This was the beginning of an entirely new aspect in her life. She ran Computer Labs for the Disabled and administered Psychological tests to determine Learning Disabilities in students in the California Community Colleges in Los Angeles and in the San Francisco Bay area for the next ten years.

The California Community Colleges provided more than these technical resources. Jean decided to enroll in their art courses for two years and got serious about pursuing her latent creative instincts.

Back east, Jean and her husband John settled near Knoxville, TN. She joined the Tennessee Watercolor Society and became involved in the competitive exhibitions and various activities, also serving on committees.

Translating her lifelong fascination with fashion into watercolor paintings of store windows with mannikins, this series has been successful for her in the TnWS exhibitions, obtaining her Signature Membership with the 2019 Online Exhibition. Also is in the Southern Watercolor Society.

During her years in Tennessee, Jean has continued to promote an interest in fashion and art. For about eight years she organized and was MC for Fashion Shows for a Charity Boutique; created a painting for the local CASA organization for auction at the Festival of Trees for five years; and established an Art Gallery in her community center where there have been continuous art exhibits for 10+ years.

Following such a varied series of careers in her lifetime. Jean discovered that her creative instincts would surface again - in a personal expression through watercolor paintings which are her current passion that still involve fashion.

"When I discovered that my first art teacher at the College of San Mateo, California, was from Paris, I said to myself -

'God has saved the best for last!' "


