# **2024 Biennial Juried Exhibition Prospectus**

### **Artist Eligibility**

The exhibition is open to artists 18 years of age and older who reside in Tennessee or meet the requirements of membership.

# Works of Art Eligibility

The artwork must have been completed since February 2021 and not shown in any previous juried **TnWS** exhibition, including online. Each artist may submit up to THREE images, but only ONE is eligible for inclusion.

### **Fees**

Members: \$40 for the first entry, \$10 for the second, \$10 for the third (\$40, \$50, \$60)

Non-Members: \$80 for the first entry, \$10 for the second, \$10 for the third (\$80, \$90, \$100)

### Requirements

**Originality:** The painting must be completely the artist's own original work – idea, content, and composition. Reference photos must be taken only by the artist. No copies of another's work or photos, published images, copyrighted material, "free online images." No paintings can be done under instruction whether online or in person.

**Watermedia:** Any water-based media is acceptable (watercolor, acrylics, gouache, casein, egg tempera, water-based ink (not water-based oil) applied in an aqueous manner (no thick paint or raised surface.) Graphite and watercolor pencils must be dissolved. Drawing or pencil marks cannot be the main element of the painting, only as guidelines or details.

**Collage:** Elements can only be paper hand-painted by the artist, not to exceed 25% of the total surface.

**Substrate:** The material painted on MUST be paper or synthetic paper like YUPO, or illustration board. There are many brands and types of watercolor paper.

**Size:** The minimum size can be 9 inches in any direction. This can include the 1/8 inch under the mat.

**Framing:** Simple, plain, un-adorned (no carving, decorations, filets, liners, etc.) wood or metal, in natural, gold, silver, or black, maximum 2 inches wide face must be used. The inside minimum size is 13 inches. The outside maximum size is 48 inches in any direction. The frame must be well constructed for shipping and handling. The frame must be wired for hanging with flat hardware (no sawtooth hangers or screw eyes) and wire ends taped.

**Glazing:** Plexiglas is REQUIRED (for safe shipping and handling) in good condition (no scratches, etc.) and properly sized for the frame.

**Matting:** Acid-free white/off-white mat with white core is REQUIRED, minimum of 2 inches wide around all sides of the painted image. Multiple mats are okay. NO color liners.

### **Digital Entries**

You will need to prepare the image of your painting in this manner: Take a high- quality (squared-up) photo of the painting only (unframed painting to avoid glare) and crop it to just the image, correctly oriented (horizontal or vertical.) Open the file and change the resolution to a minimum of 300 pixels per inch, up to a maximum of 1800 pixels on the LONGER side, saved as maximum quality not to exceed 3 megabytes. Name the file as: Artist Name (LastFirst) PaintingTitle size (HxW).

Example: DoeJane RedTulips 20h12w.

EMAIL IMAGE FILES TO: tnws.exhibitions@gmail.com. The ENTRY FORM (including these instructions) will be on the website prior to the JANUARY 1 to FEBRUARY 15, 2024 entry period. This allows time for you to obtain assistance if necessary. Complete the Entry Form and pay the Entry Fee to complete the process. For help, contact the TnWS Intake Chair.

### **Sales**

A **TnWS** contract will be available in the event a painting is sold. This contract will be signed by the venue and the buyer and will provide contact information. The artist is responsible for negotiating shipping terms with the buyer and ensuring delivery at the close of the Exhibition or Traveling Exhibit. The painting must stay with the Exhibition and Traveling Exhibit (if the painting is chosen for the Traveling Exhibit) until the end. Remember to include the venue commissionwhen pricing. The maximum commission being charged by a venue is 25%.

I have carefully read all requirements listed in this prospectus and I understand that failure to meet ANY of the requirements may result in the disqualification of my entry and the possibility of ineligibility to enter future TnWS juried exhibitions for a minimum of two years.

### **IMPORTANT OPPORTUNITIES FOR ARTISTS**

**The Totally Transparent Watercolor Award:** Artists who prepare their paintings using only transparent watermedia pigments with no white pigments, using only the white of the paper, can apply for this special award if their entry is accepted.

**The Traveling Exhibit:** 30 paintings selected by the juror to travel for six months visiting four different galleries across the state is a special honor.

**Exhibition Awards:** An impressive number of generous cash and merchandise awards, including Best of Show are presented to award winners at the end of the workshop week and after the General Meeting. The images of all the accepted paintings and award winners will be prominently displayed on the **TnWS** website and in the full-color published exhibition catalog received by all members and sponsors, as well as, available for sale to the public at each venue.

# **Don Andrews Workshop Is Over Half Filled Already!**

In only a few days, a number of **TnWS** members had signed up for the **Don Andrews Workshop**, more than halfway filling the class up! A tremendous response shows a strong



desire to learn from this popular instructor. **Don's** Landscape Workshop is geared specifically for artists eager to paint and study in a no-stress studio environment. Each day, Don will address major visual concerns; light, color, granulation, organizing nature, and utilizing negative space are just a few subjects to be covered.

Don's class is not geared to any specific level of achievement; artists of all levels will benefit from a

more personal understanding of the painting possibilities available in the exciting world of landscape painting. This workshop will be packed with demonstrations, discussions, individual help, and persona and group critiques.

# **HELPFUL TIP: Resizing Images**

Often, we have trouble getting our painting images sized to meet the prospectus requirements. For the **TnWS 2024 Biennial Exhibition**, the requirement is:

**Digital Entries:** You will need to prepare the image of your painting in this manner: Take a high-quality (squared-up) photo of the painting only (unframed painting to avoid glare) and crop it to just the image, correctly oriented (horizontal or vertical.) Open the file and change the resolution to 300 pixels per inch, sized to 1800 pixels on the LONGER side, saved as maximum quality not to exceed 3 megabytes. Name the file as: Artist Name (LastFirst)\_PaintingTitle\_size (HxW).

Example: DoeJane\_RedTulips\_20h12w.

So how do I get my image to be 300 pixels per inch and 1800 pixels on the longer side? You can do it with the software on your PC or Mac, no additional software required. Go to these YouTube videos to see how.

# **A Surplus Solution**

Every artist who is a prolific producer accumulates a stack of unframed paintings and prints. Exhausting all the competitions and sales opportunities, then what do you do with that surplus?

This was my situation two years ago. I was in the habit of having each painting professionally scanned and printed for my own records. So, I had a stack of prints going nowhere. Most of the unsold originals went to family, and some prints to friends. Now what?

It occurred to me that families who qualify to receive new homes from **Habitat for Humanity** probably do not have artwork to put on their walls. I wrote to the Executive Director of the Cleveland office with my idea to share my art. She put me in touch with the Manager of Homeowner Services. When I met with her, I brought a selection of my prints for her approval. She loved the idea. So, we worked out a plan.







I picked 40 of my prints of various subjects - florals, architecture, scenes, and miscellaneous. Most were 14"x10" so with a 3" white mat they became 20"x16". I put each print with mat and foam-core in a clear bag, titled on the back. The Manager showed the prints to the prospective new homeowners when they came to her office for their training sessions. I offered each family to choose four 16x20s, two 11x14 or 12x12, and one large 22x28. After the Manager gave me the list of their selections I went to my inventory, cut the mats and bought frames at Hobby Lobby and Michaels at 50% off. After I assembled them, they were ready for presentation at each dedication ceremony.

My new project needed a name. I chose "ART from the Heart" and designed my own unique logo which I printed on 3x4 labels to put on the back of each print. I didn't realize that was a very popular slogan, as I thought it was my own idea when I created it. I wanted to remain anonymous, so did not use my name.

To date I have given my prints to eleven families (through December 2023) bringing colorful artwork to be enjoyed by 37 individuals in their new homes.



In addition to time and effort, the expense for materials may not be possible for everyone to do. Consider interesting a generous benefactor in supporting your efforts financially so you can still contribute your artwork and present it. You can tailor your effort to fit what works for you, and donate just one print at a time. I just wanted to share my idea, and would love to see it spread to other **Habitat for Humanity** locations, even nationwide.

# In Memorium


Joe "Cheap Joe" Miller died September 6, 2023 at the age of 84.

Excerpts from Cheap Joe's Art Stuff Message and High Country Press Obituary

Joe lived his life demonstrating immense courage, gentleness, and a beloved spirit which anyone who met him knew. Many of you have enjoyed his workshops or met

him in his Boone NC shop while looking for art supplies or taking one of the many workshops offered there. His company has supported TnWS exhibitions since 1996 with gifts of merchandise for our awards.

Born on February 17th, 1939, Joe's life was always connected in some way to the arts. While he initially set forth to become a taxidermist with dreams of becoming a museum conservator, he eventually settled in at UNC Chapel Hill's School of Pharmacy. It was in practice at Boone Drug and while moonlighting as an artist that he began a small, corner "shop" he jokingly named "Cheap Joe's Art Stuff." The name stuck, and Joe later left his pharmacy career to grow Cheap Joe's into a force in the art materials world.



Joe built a solid foundation at Cheap Joe's – one rooted in personal, friendly, often humorous interactions. It was how he approached his customers (often personally delivering packages when traveling across the U.S.). It is with honor and great respect that we carry forward his tremendous legacy.

Joe's passion and dedication to the art world earned him numerous accolades and awards – his highest honors being the recipient of the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award, American Watercolor Society Dolphin Medal, North Carolina Order of the Long Leaf Pine, and NWS Arts and Humanities Award for his contributions to his extremely broad community.

To honor Joe, contributions may be made to **Brushes for Vincent** – a charitable organization designed by Joe to provide art supplies to children in hospitals and give people in distress healing through art.

Now 85, **Marilynn** is preparing for a big solo exhibit, at least 150 works. She fell in January 2019 and broke her arm, wrist, and hip. It was a dreadful mishap that left her unable to hold a brush. When she realized she had lost all ability to make a beautiful flat and flawless wash with watercolor, she decided she had to find a new way to create loose and free paintings. It took four years, but she finally succeeded in discovering how to paint again. Using four approaches to apply gouache self-made stencils provided control, while squiggles and paint droplets added the loose freedom she souaht.

The exhibit includes very small experiments, 2" x 4" (some framed,

most matted only) then gradually shifting to bigger images and finally full watercolor sheets, 22" x 30". All works are posted on **Marilynn's website**. Though **Marilynn** does not personally know all members of the **Tennessee Watercolor Society**, she would be happy for you to attend the opening on Saturday, October 7 2-5 pm (artist talk at 3 pm) at her son's business, Insurance Professionals of Tennessee. Marilynn chose this place because there will be no commission charged and she will donate all sale profits to Ball State University for a painting scholarship. The show will be open weekdays, during business hours, 9-4 pm. Marilynn would appreciate any comments from you.






